This faith-filled step is a commitment to a vibrant future:





Site Plan










Questions and Answers

What is the goal of our capital campaign?

The goal of this campaign is for every member and friend of the congregation to participate and be a part of the future of First Presbyterian Church. Dollars raised are important, but it is more important for everyone to feel a part of the future of our church. We hope that everyone, after prayerful consideration, will want to participate in whatever way is best for them.

Also, we know that a meaningful aspect of our faith is looking to the future, trusting divine promises, and living into the peace and love and justice of God made real in the world. Sharing a vision for our church's future adds deeper meaning to our journeys of faith

Why do we need a second capital campaign? Our first campaign was very successful a second campaign allows our church to preserve the money invested with the Presbyterian Foundation. The Presbyterian Investment and Loan Program prepared a cash flow analysis for the Finance Committee that showed a second campaign would permit the church to continue to use the income from investments to fund operations, pay the debt on the construction loan, and not use any of the principal invested with the Foundation. If we do not conduct a second campaign, principal would need to be spent and the future income for the mission and ministry of our church would be less.

What will the funds from this new capital campaign be used for? Are we adding projects or did something change?

The funds will be used to pay for the construction loan. Unfortunately, as often happens with construction projects, the costs have increased from the initial estimates. No new projects have been added, although we have had to make some additional repairs as we discovered damage during renovation. Also, inflation and the costs of materials and labor have increased significantly over the last three years.

Second, we always anticipated a need for a second campaign. Once we reviewed the increased construction costs and the cash flow analysis prepared by PILP, it became apparent that the second campaign is vital to preserving our investment for future mission and ministry of our congregation.

Can we just ask people to continue their pledges from the first campaign?

The second campaign, like the first, is for each member and friend to prayerfully consider how we can best assist the mission

of our church. After such prayerful consideration, if it blesses them, they are welcome to continue their pledge from the first campaign. We have many new members since the last campaign and welcome everyone to participate in the future of the church.

Why don't we spend principal from our investments? Spending the investments is an option; however, it would then mean less money available in the future for our ministries and mission.

With organized religion on the decline in this country, how do I know my investment is a wise one?

Over history, the death of organized religion has been widely predicted and never fulfilled! Historically, our church has been at the forefront of serving the Springfield community in whatever way was needed at the time. As we begin our 3rd century as a worshiping community, we believe that we will continue to serve the Springfield community for a long while. Our new members and new ministries are inspiring to long time members. Your investment in this campaign permits the church to collaborate in ministry with our community partners and maintain our mission for decades to come.

Why are you asking me to participate?

This Capital Campaign for First Presbyterian Church is similar to other foundational campaigns. The foundation of our programs - art camps, Joy of Movement, our relationship to the Lincoln family, Habitat for Humanity are just a few. Many programs essential to the Springfield Community had their start because of our congregation. To move forward, to expand who we are without sacrificing our future, we need this second capital campaign. Supporting this campaign strengthens the foundations of our church - its buildings. But strong buildings that are empty aren't much to move forward with. Supporting who the church is - its programming and what it can do for our congregation and community- moves our church forward.

Any last message for me to prayerfully consider?

Our first capital campaign was enormously successful. However, no one could have anticipated the significant cost increases we have faced during planning and construction. While safeguarding our finances, we will safeguard the future of our congregation and our Church. That way, this community and we can continue the work of the generations before us. As we have been blessed by the vision of our predecessors, we trust our vision will bless future generations of joy!
